



MOOSE CHARITIES UPDATE

As a Fraternity, the members of the Lodges and Chapters were able to make the School Renovation Project at Mooseheart a reality. A total of \$11.5 million was raised to complete this much needed project.

At the International Convention in Nashville a new project was introduced by Moosehaven Executive Director John Capes. The Moosehaven Centennial Project will improve the quality of life for our Moosehaven residents and reduce the operating costs. The goal of this project is to construct a new congregate living facility for Moosehaven's traditional residents. The scope of this project is to construct a three-story building with two wings. There will be 105 residential apartments, up-to-date technologies, an in-house kitchen and dining area as well as barber and beauty shops, a campus nurse program and also a covered tricycle parking area!!

The Supreme Council and the Moosehaven Board have approved the \$10 million Capital Campaign. All Lodges, Chapters, Moose Legions and Councils of Higher Degree are encouraged to send donations to Moose Charities earmarked either "Association Cent. Project" or "WOTM Cent. Project". The Women of the Moose have pledged \$2,000,000 to the Moosehaven Centennial Project.

Let's keep the momentum going – we have helped the children at Mooseheart, now it is time to help our seniors at Moosehaven.
