This is to announce that there will be an Administrator workshop on April 19, 2018

at the New York State Mid-Year Convention in Binghamton, NY starting at 1 PM going until 6 PM.

This workshop will have computers and trainers available for Administrators needing certification for Administrator School to take the Skills assessment for the Administrator School, and if desired, the Quick Books and LCL.NET assessment tests.

There will be no cost for this workshop, however you must be registered for the Convention to attend.

Please send an e-mail to David Farrell, NYSMA Training Coordinator at dfarrell@moosetrainers.org to register for the workshop.

Obtaining certification in QuickBooks, LCL.NET and the Administrator skills is required by the Supreme Council and Moose International to maintain status as an Administrator of a Lodge. Experienced Administrators should be able to pass the tests without much of a problem.

At the current time, less than 6 Administrators in the Association are fully certified, and I encourage every Administrator to attend the workshop and get their certification.

In the event you are unable to attend, training can be scheduled at a site, if at least 8 attendees are registered and attend the training. The formal training class is 3 days in length, and covers all facets of the Administrator's position. Please contact David Farrell at

<u>dfarrell@moosetrainers.org</u> in the event you want to organize an Administrator training session in your area.

In any case, the certification gained is good for 3 years.

I am asking you to support the goal of having all officers of every lodge having completed the required training for their officers at all times.




