Prior to this post, Harry served as the Supreme Jr. Governor (2017-2018), and as a member of the Supreme Council - the fraternity's Corporate Board of Directors (2008-2017); and served on the Judiciary Committee (2003-2008).

Harry joined the fraternity as a member of Greeley-Evans, CO Lodge 909 in 1986. He served through the

finished in the top three individually in International Ritual competition eight times, winning the International Shining Star as Lodge Ritualist of the Year in 2004. He has also served on and chaired numerous lodge committees.


