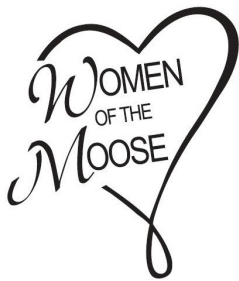

A friendly reminder to each of us that kind words are like honey to the soul and healthy for the body, so remember to always be kind to one another.

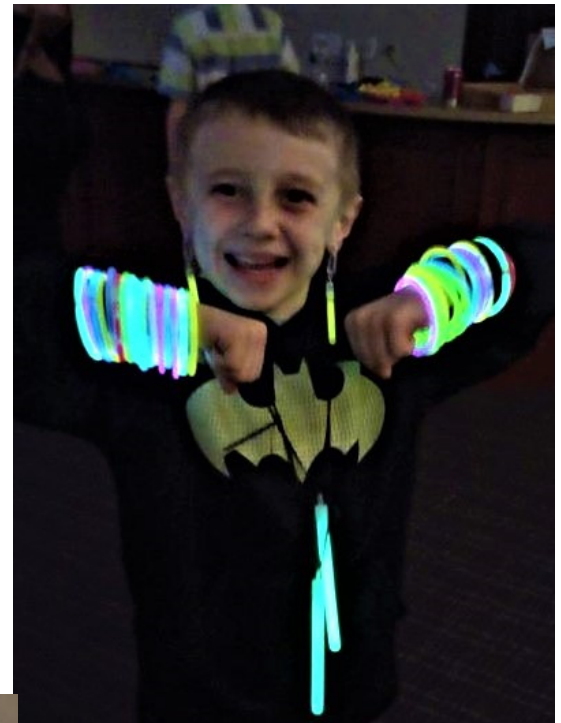
